About The Exam

The computer-based CDT examination lasts two and a half hours and contains 115 multiple-choice questions. The exam is administered at Prometric test centers nationwide. To view the Prometric test center locations, visit www.prometric.com/CSI and select "Locate a Testing Center". To pass, candidates must receive a grade of 75 percent or higher.

Full-time students may register for the CDT exam at a discounted rate.

The CDT application fee includes registration, study guide, and examination. It does not include the source materials.
